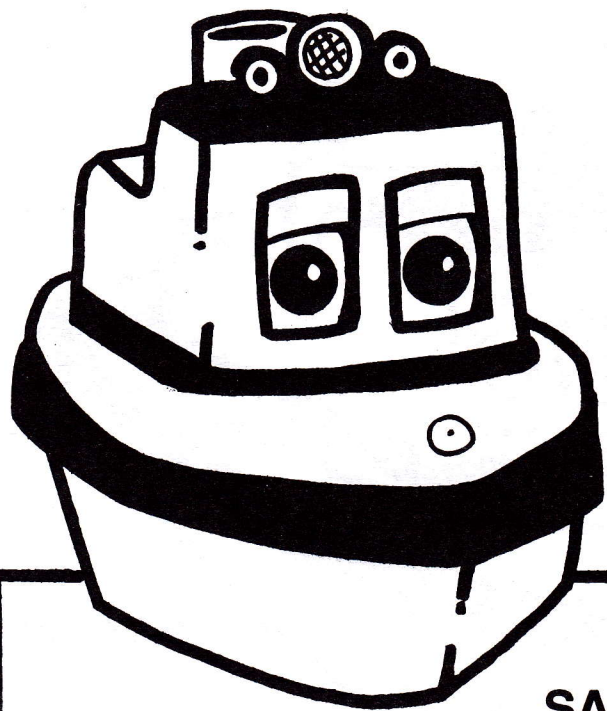


If you are going to be around the water, make sure you learn how to swim. It is not only safe, but fun too!!



If you ever get into trouble in the water, lifeguards, boating safety officers and rangers are there to help you.

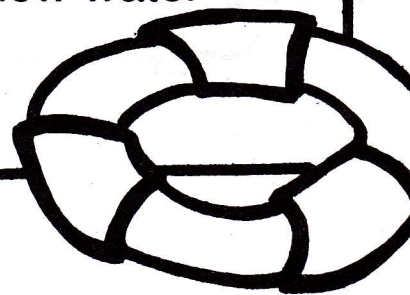




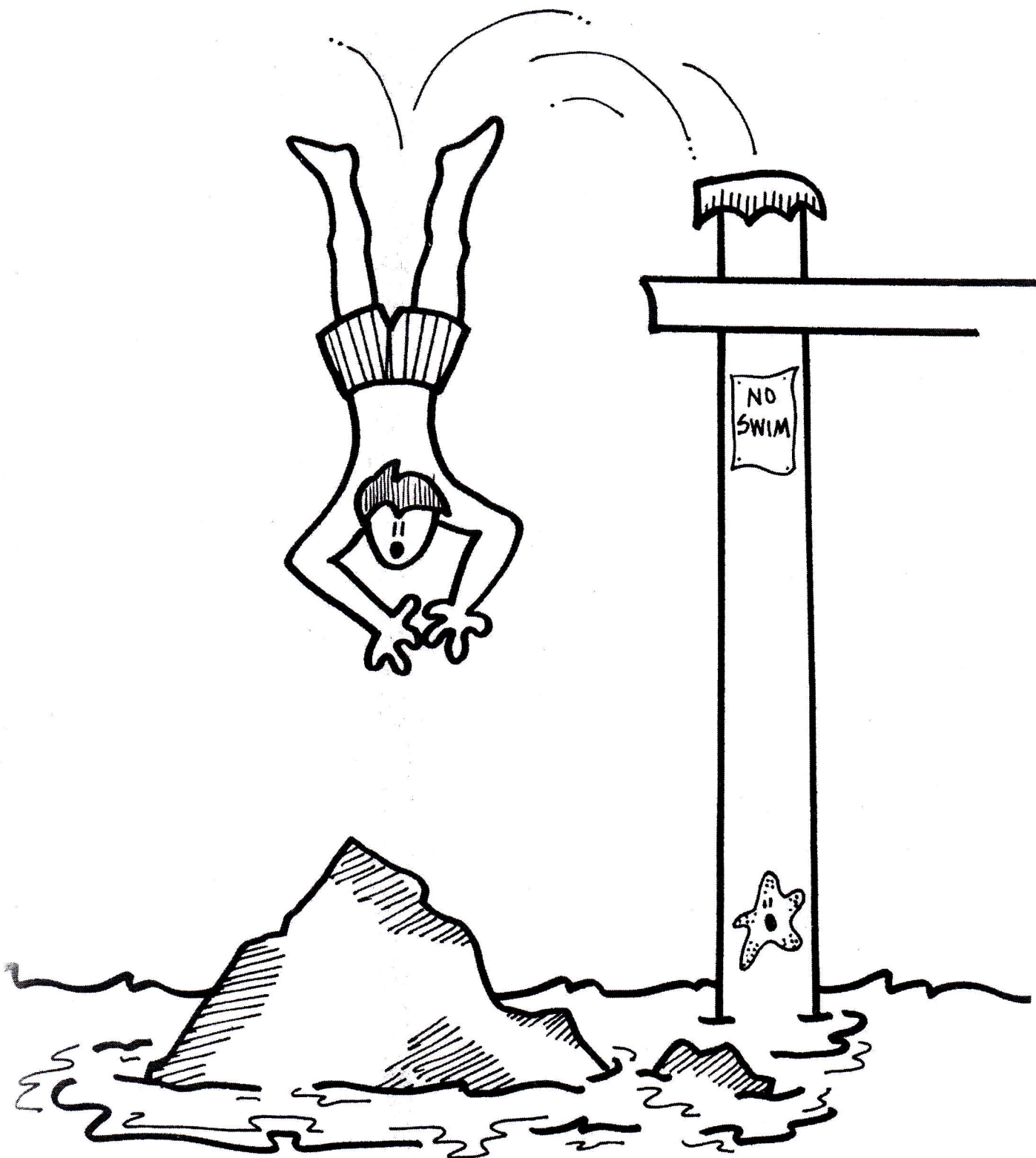
Be sure to know the safety rules before you get in the water.

- Beginning swimmers should stay in the shallow water



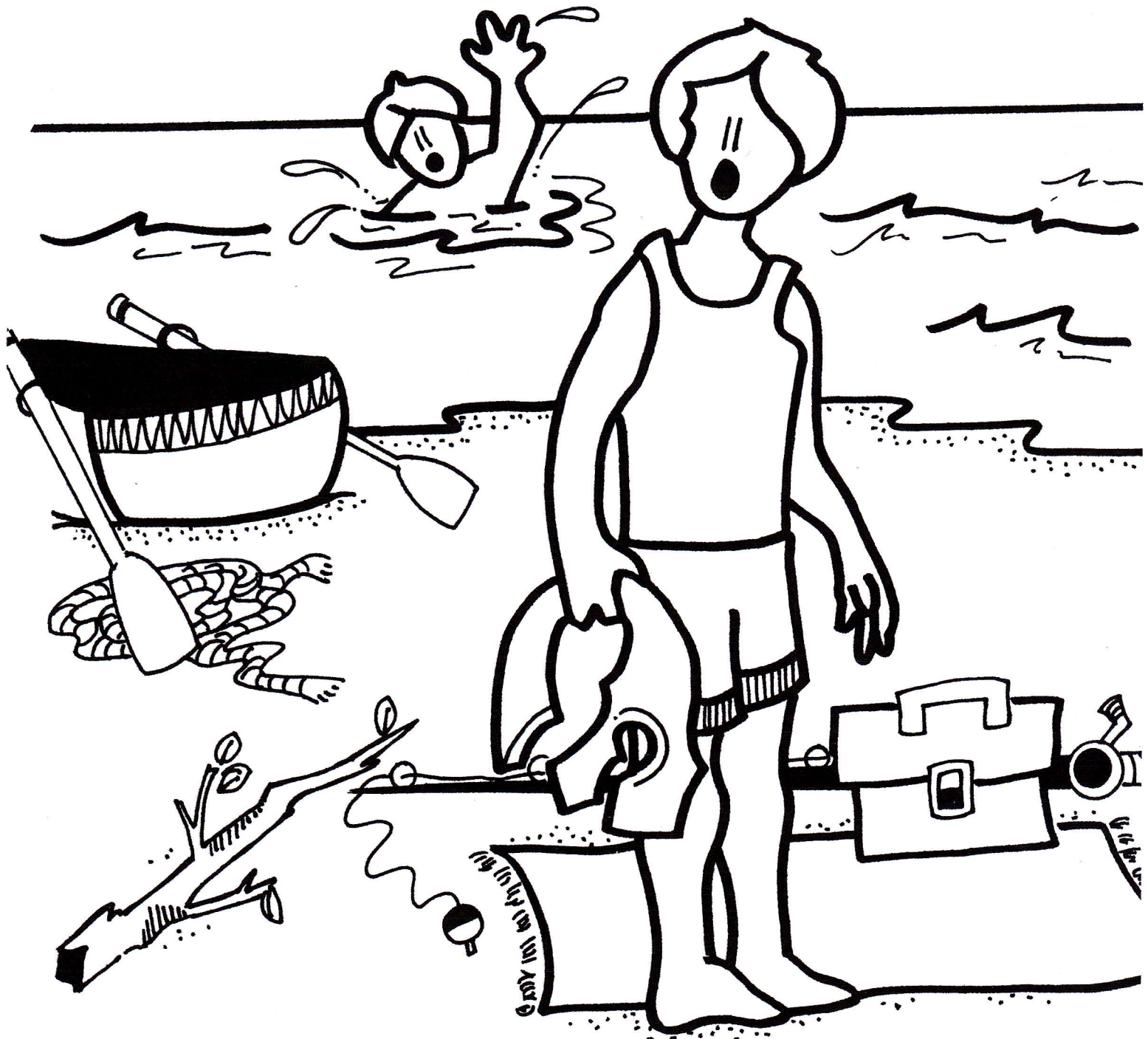
Juan forgot to read the rules before he went swimming.

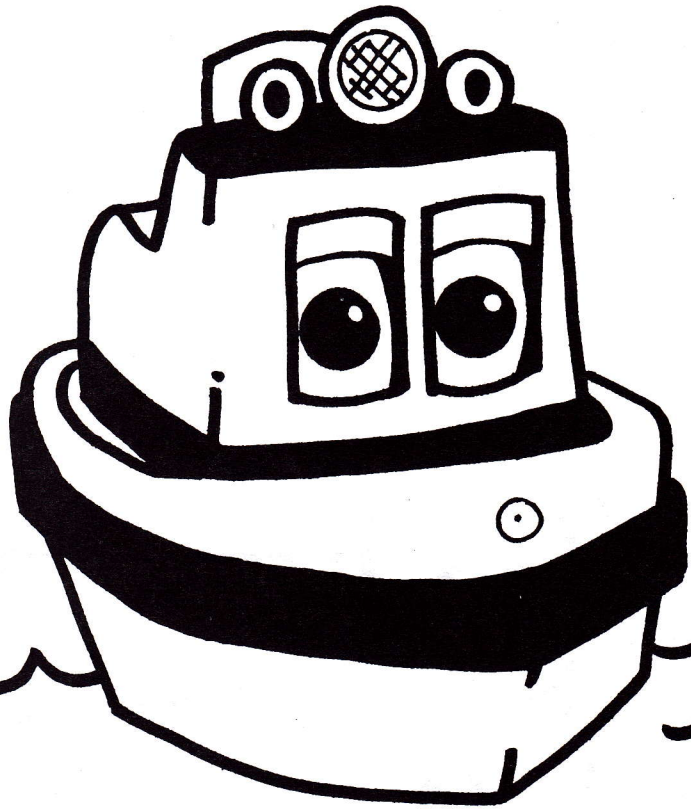


Tashia is in trouble. Her toy has popped and she doesn't know how to swim very well. What can Darryl throw to help her float?

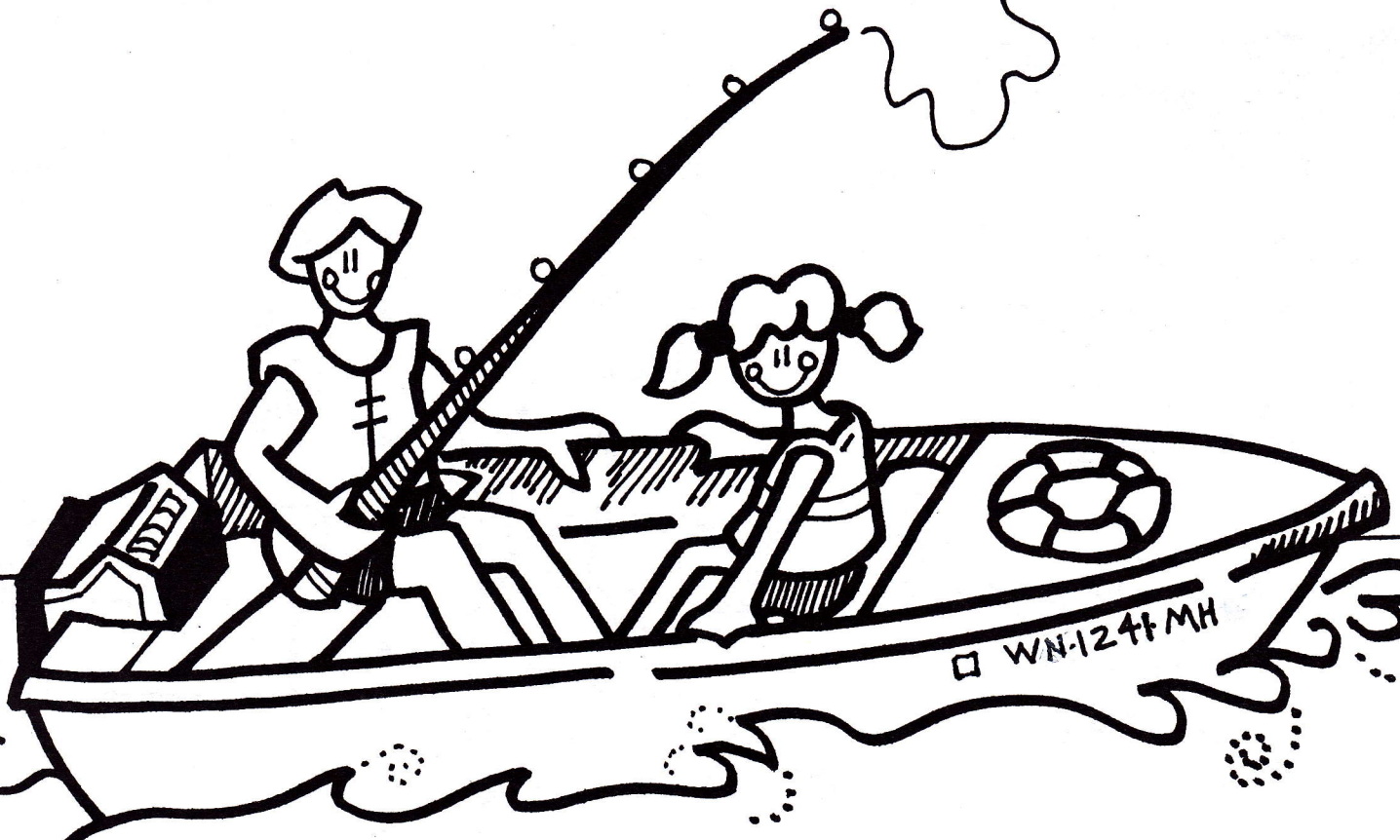
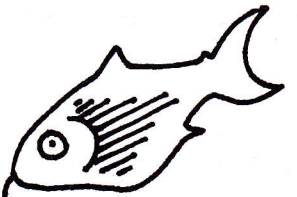


The water is deeper than it seems. How can Mark reach out to help Rob?

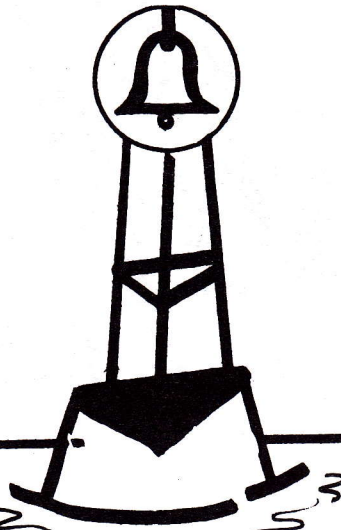
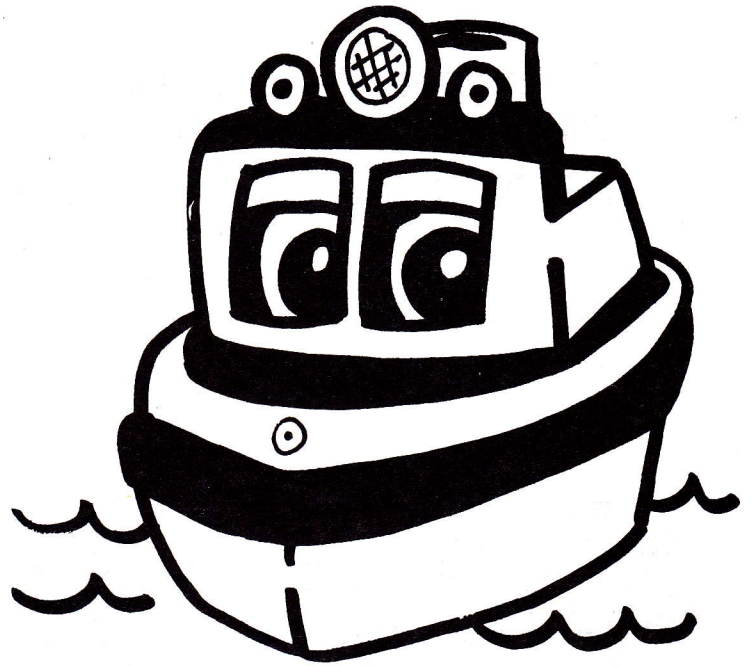




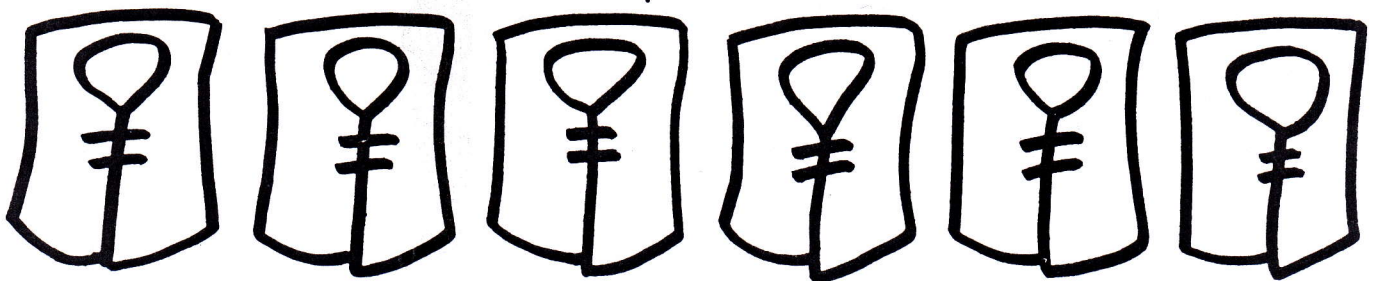

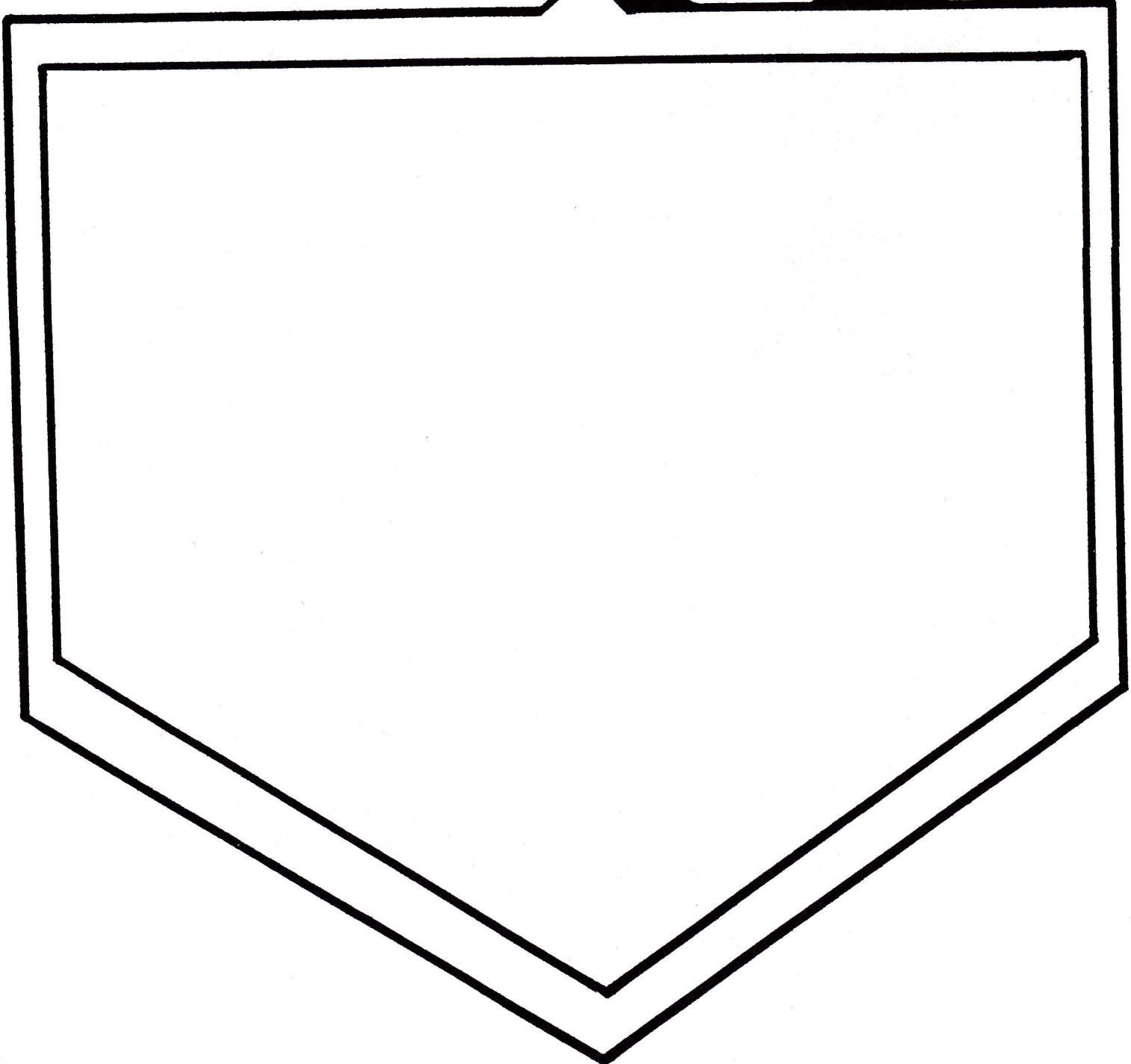
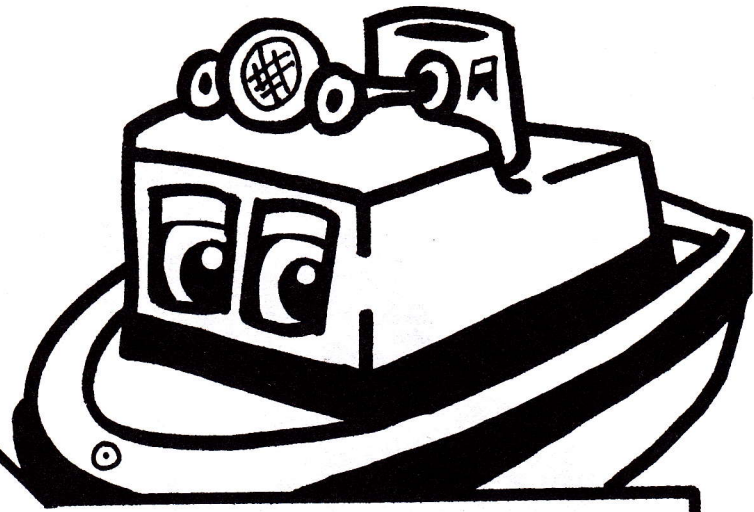
When you boat, there are certain safety rules to follow. These rules will help prevent boating accidents. These people aren't following the safety rules.

people in the raft. Don't forget your PFD or lifejacket!

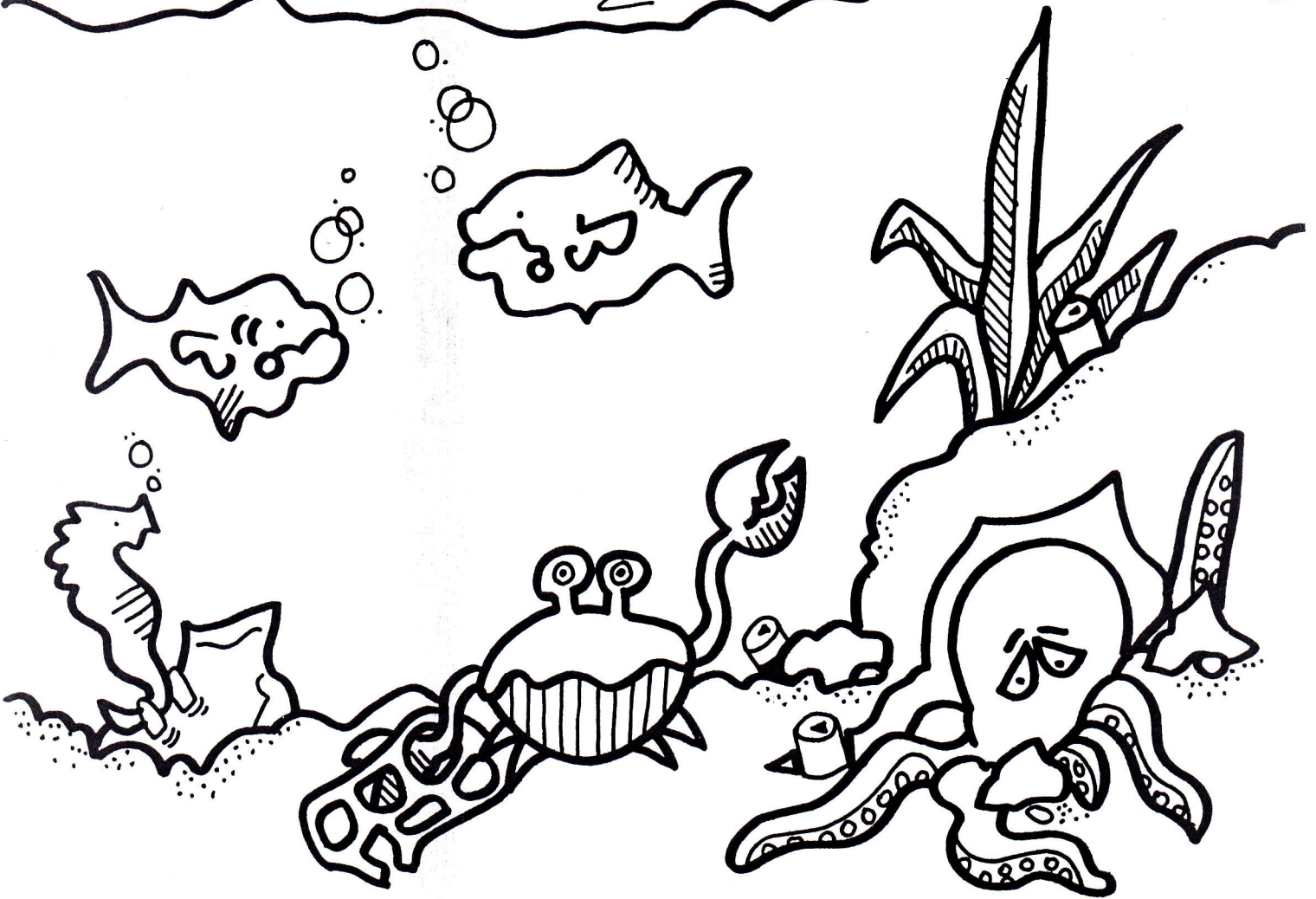
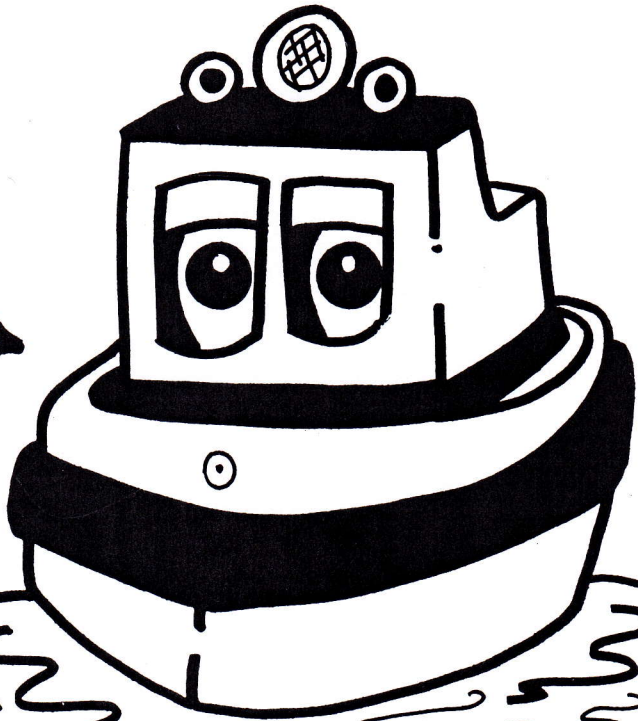


I share the water with all different types of boats. Draw your favorite kind of boat.

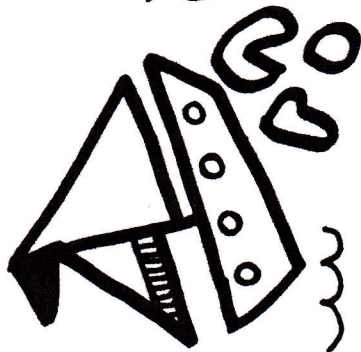
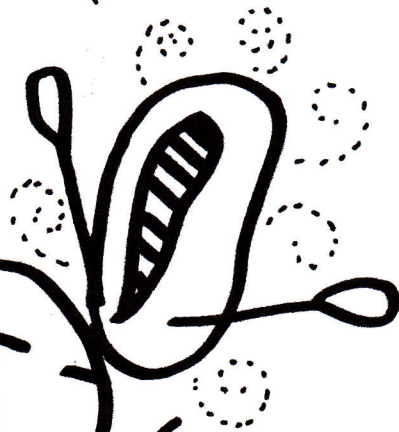
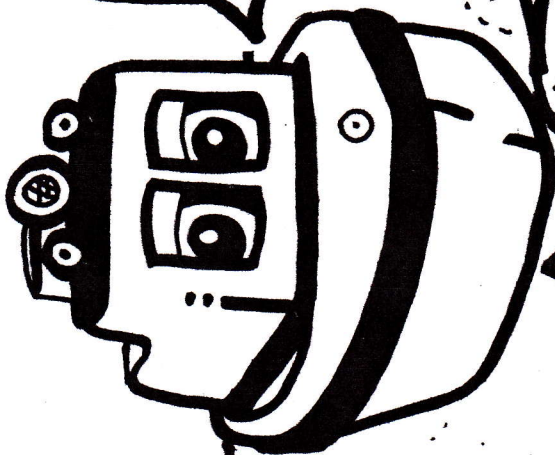


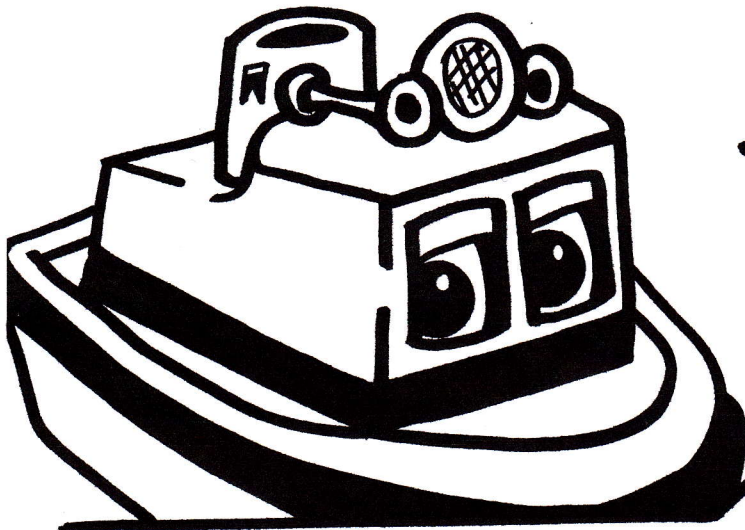


People sometimes throw their garbage in the water. This trash isn't good for the fish and their friends. Find the hidden pieces of litter, so they can have a clean home.

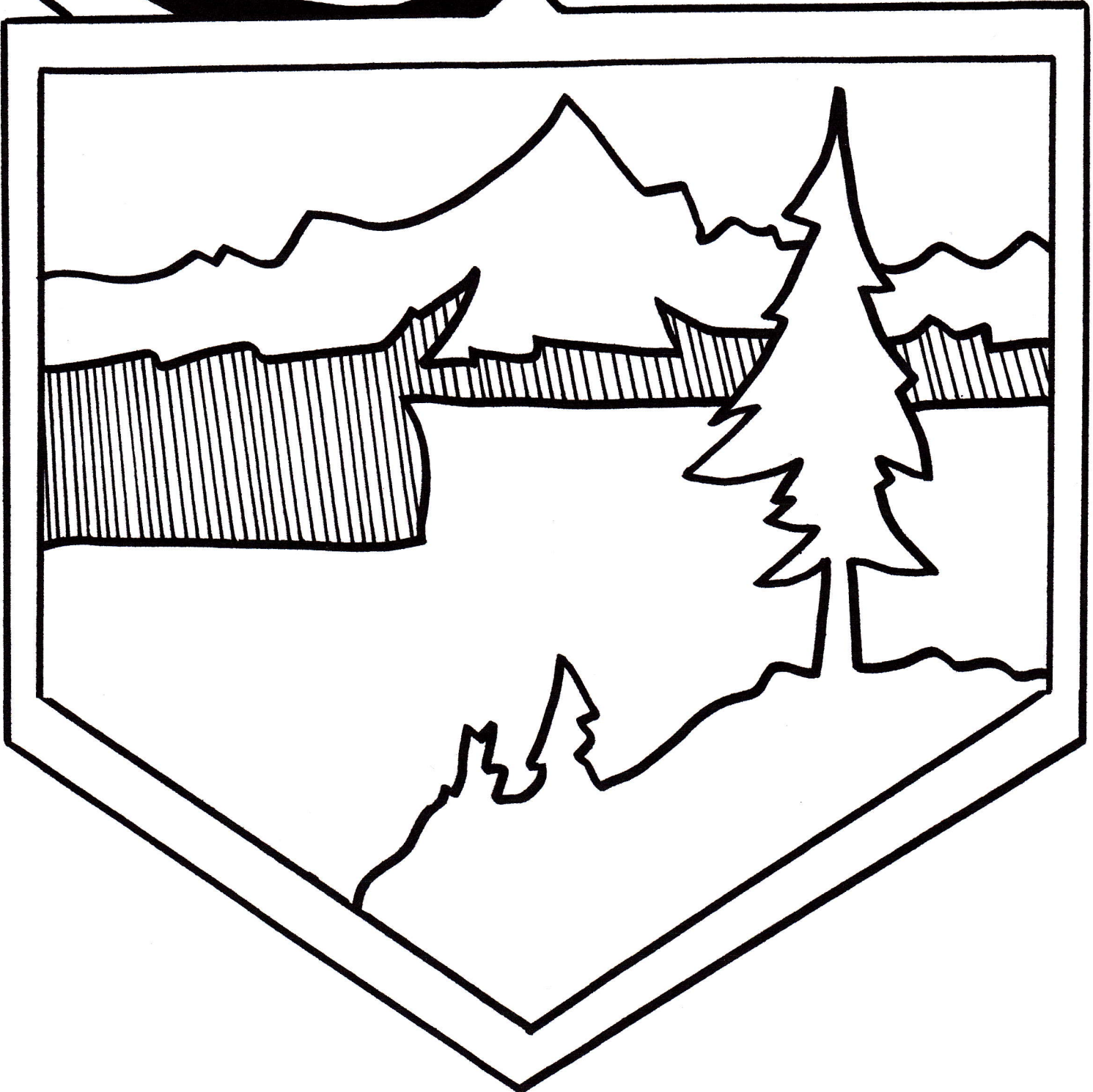


The State of Washington has many different bodies of water for different water activities. Here are a few examples.



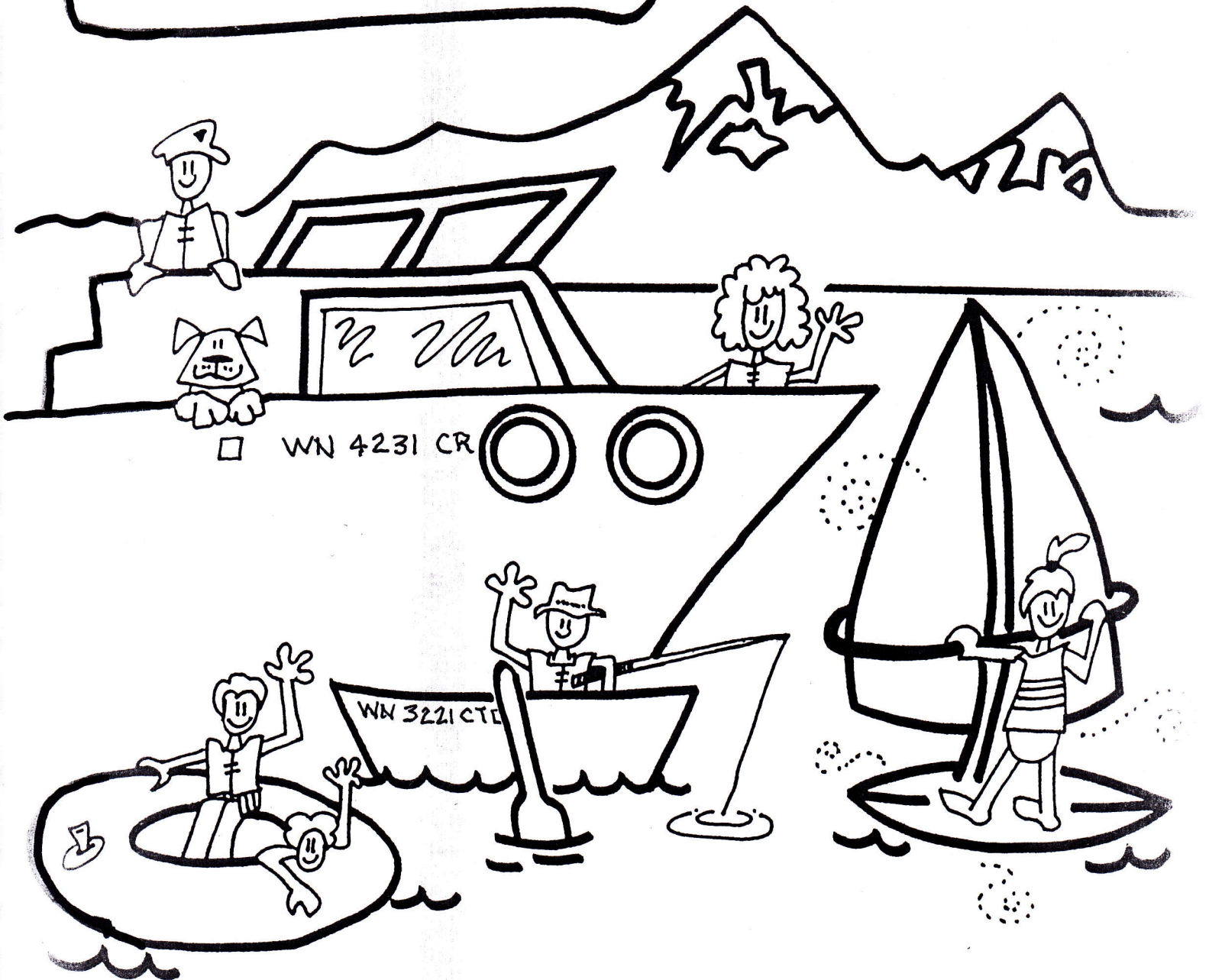

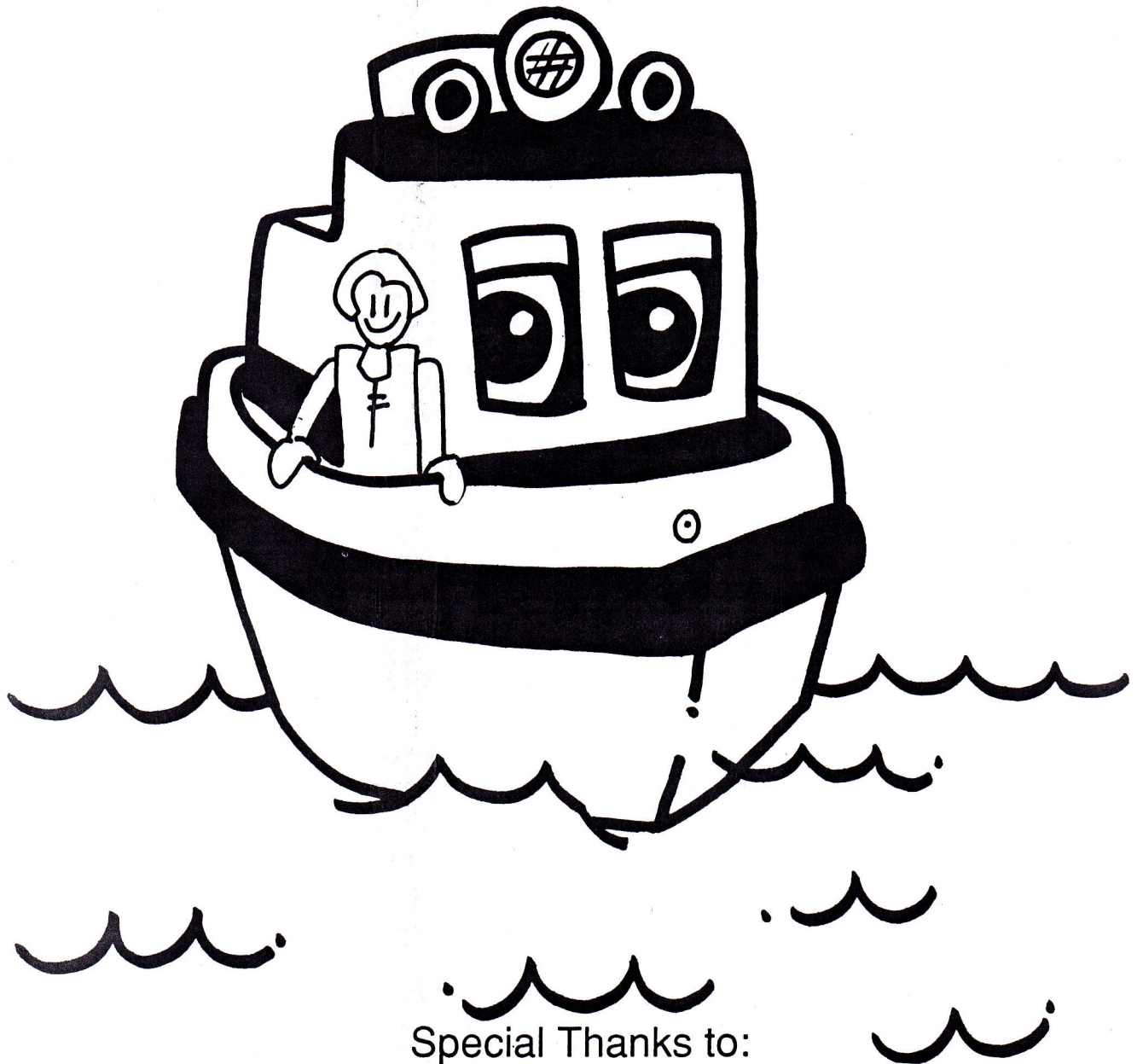
